Subject: Invitation to tender ENER/C3/2014-560 concerning the EU ENERGY STAR Programme: Development and Maintenance of the Website and Technical Support for the development of new Technical Specifications

Ref: contract notice in OJEU 2014/S 156-279499 of 16/08/2014

This tender is subdivided into **2 Lots**. Tenders may be submitted for one Lot or both:

Lot 1: Website Development and Maintenance

The EU Energy star website (<http://www.eu-energystar.org>) is an essential instrument for the implementation of the EU ENERGY STAR Programme which aims at improving the energy efficiency of Office Equipment. The site contains relevant information related to the programme, including the applicable legal texts, forms for product and partner registrations, continuously updated database of registered products, the list of partner companies, links to relevant websites, search tools for identifying the most efficient equipment per category.

Crucial updates are necessary as a result of the revision of the Annex C to the EU-US ENERGY STAR Agreement (OJEU L 63, volume 56 of 6 March 2013, including any further modification).

The tender aims at covering the development and maintenance of the website starting in January 2015.

Lot 2: Technical Support for the Development of new Technical Specifications

The tender aims at covering the cost of expertise in office equipment technology, in particular as regards the energy performance and eco-design aspects of such equipment. The task is to advise the European Commission and the European Union ENERGY STAR Board (EUESB) in developing new specifications for revising Annex C of the EU-US ENERGY STAR Agreement (OJEU L 63, volume 56 of 6 March 2013, including any further modification).

The tender aims at providing the Commission with technical support for the development of new technical specifications starting in January 2015.

1. The European Commission is planning to award the public contract referred to above. Please find enclosed the related tender specification listing all the documents that must be produced in order to submit a tender, and the draft contract.
2. If you are interested in this contract, you should submit a tender in **one original** in one of the official languages of the European Union, presented as follows:

Part A: Identification of the tenderer (see section 1.6 of tender specifications)

Part B: Evidence for exclusion criteria (see section 2.2 of tender specifications)

Part C: Evidence for selection criteria (see section 2.3 of tender specifications)

Part D: Technical offer (see section 2.5 of tender specifications)

Part E: Financial offer (see section 2.6 of tender specifications)

Part F: Power of attorney (for consortia only)

and four separate copies of part D.

A copy of the offer (all parts) on a CD/DVD/USB stick, in PDF format, has also to be submitted.

Tenderers shall submit tenders by letter:

- a) Either **by post or by courier not later than 22/09/2014**, in which case the evidence of the date of dispatch shall be constituted by the postmark or the date of the deposit slip, to the address indicated below; or
- b) Delivered **by hand not later than 16:00 on 22/09/2014** to the address indicated below. In this case, a receipt must be obtained as proof of submission, signed and dated by the official in the Commission's central mail department who took delivery.

The department is open from 08.00 to 17.00 Monday to Thursday, and from 8.00 to 16.00 on Fridays. It is closed on Saturdays, Sundays and Commission holidays.

Tenders must be placed inside two sealed envelopes. **The inner envelope, addressed as indicated above, should be marked as follows: "CALL FOR TENDERS – NOT TO BE**

OPENED BY THE INTERNAL MAIL DEPARTMENT ". If self-adhesive envelopes are used, they must be sealed with adhesive tape and the sender must sign across this tape.

The inner envelope must also contain two sealed envelopes, one containing the technical tender and the other the financial tender. Each of these envelopes must clearly indicate the content ("Technical" and "Financial").

For your bid to be found admissible the confidentiality thereof must have been ensured and the deadline for the submission of the bids met.

3. Tenders will be opened at 11 a.m. on 30/09/2014, at 24 Rue De Mot, office 4/101, Directorate-General for Energy, unit C3, 1040-Brussels, Belgium.


Tenderers may attend the meeting but be represented by not more than one person. At the end of the opening session, the Chairman of the opening committee will indicate the name of the tenderers and the decision concerning the admissibility of each offer received. The prices mentioned in the bids will not be communicated.

4. Tenders must be:
 - Signed by a duly authorised representative of the tenderer. The original signature of the single tenderer's or lead partner's authorised representative (preferably in blue ink) on the identification form (Annex 1 of the technical specifications) shall be considered as the signature of the tender, binding the single tenderer or the group of partners to the terms included in the tender;
 - Perfectly legible so that there can be no doubt as to words and figures.
5. The period of validity of the tender, during which tenderers may not modify the terms of their tenders in any respect, is six months from the final date for submission.
6. **Submission of a tender implies acceptance of all the terms and conditions set out in this invitation to tender, in the tender specification and in the draft contract and, where appropriate, waiver of the tenderer's own general or specific terms and conditions.** Submission of a tender is binding on the tenderer to whom the contract is awarded for the duration of the contract.
7. All costs incurred during the preparation and submission of tenders are to be borne by the tenderers and will not be reimbursed.
8. Contacts between the contracting authority and tenderers are prohibited throughout the procedure save in exceptional circumstances and under the following conditions only:
 - Before the final date for submission of tenders:
 - * At the request of the tenderer, the contracting authority may provide additional information solely for the purpose of clarifying the nature of the contract.

Any requests for additional information must be made in writing only to ENER-TENDER-2014-560@ec.europa.eu. Requests for additional information received less than five working days before the final date for submission of tenders will not be processed.

- * The Commission may, on its own initiative, inform interested parties of any error, inaccuracy, omission or any other clerical error in the text of the call for tenders.
 - * Any additional information including that referred to above will be posted on http://ec.europa.eu/dgs/energy/tenders/index_en.htm. The website will be updated regularly and it is the tenderers' responsibility to check for updates and modifications during the tendering period.
- After the opening of tenders
- * If clarification is required or if obvious clerical errors in the tender need to be corrected, the contracting authority may contact the tenderer provided the terms of the tender are not modified as a result.
9. This invitation to tender is in no way binding on the Commission. The Commission's contractual obligation commences only upon signature of the contract with the successful tenderer.
 10. Up to the point of signature, the contracting authority may either abandon the procurement or cancel the award procedure, without the candidates or tenderers being entitled to claim any compensation. This decision must be substantiated and the candidates or tenderers notified.
 11. Once the Commission has opened the tender, the document shall become the property of the Commission and it shall be treated confidentially.
 12. Tenderers will be informed of the outcome of this procurement procedure.
 13. If processing the reply to the invitation to tender involves the recording and processing of personal data (such as name, addresses and CVs), such data will be processed pursuant to Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the Community institutions and bodies and on the free movement of such data. Unless indicated otherwise, the replies to the questions and any personal data requested are required to evaluate the tender in accordance with the specifications of the invitation to tender and will be processed solely for that purpose by [*entity acting as data controller*].
