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# Brief timeline of the process

- February 2019: Slovenia requests to join the Coal Regions in Transition Initiative
- May 2019: setting up national working groups with different stakeholders
- July 2019: Kick-off meeting with the European Commission, start of preparing the request for technical support
- Spring 2020: DG REFORM hires external expert and technical support (Deloitte)
- June 2020: Kick-off meeting with Deloitte, preparation of national strategy starts
- September 2020: First draft national strategy published, strategic environmental procedure (SEA) starts
- March April 2021: official public consultation of the strategy and the environmental report
- autumn 2020 spring 2021: preparation of draft territorial plans

## 2 COAL REGIONS

#### SAVINJSKO – ŠALEŠKA REGION



- ▶ 150 years of mining tradition
- An active lignite underground mine with 1.800 employees
- TEŠ power plant supplying 30% of Slovenia's electricity
- Industry connected to the use of coal generates around 30 % of local economy (2018)
- Additional 1500 to 2000 work force dependent on the income of coal-related activities

#### ZASAVJE REGION

- Coal-mining since 1804
- No active coal mine, closed in 2007
- 5000 jobs lost since 1995, economic recovery of the region is still not complete
- ▶ In 2017, only 52,4 % of Slovenia's GDP per capita
