Report on the dialogue with Slovenian stakeholders.

The fifth stakeholders' energy dialogue was held by the EC representation in Slovenia, on 15 July, a day after the Commission College adopted the <u>package of legislative proposals aimed to deliver the European Green Deal</u>.

The dialogue took place during the high-level webinar 'Climate energy package "Fit for 55"- How will the new legislative package affect the economy and how should the economy prepare?', organised in cooperation with the Center of Energy Efficiency Solutions (CER) in Slovenia.

In the context of the European Green Deal, and in particular the aforementioned new climate and energy package, the online event highlighted the legislative proposals to the relevant Slovenian stakeholders from different fields (environment, energy, economy, and finance) and opened the public discussion around the package.

Representatives of the EU and national decision-makers, financial institutions, creators of the business landscape and the future presented their views on what opportunities and challenges the new proposed legislative framework brings, and what will need to be done to achieve the new goals.

There were 180 participants registered from 144 organisations. The event was web streamed by the Slovenian Press Agency that added some 1,500 additional views.

Ivo Schmidt, Deputy Head of Unit Economic Analysis and Foresight, Recovery, gave a presentation on the economic implications of the package for the Slovenian businesses. The presentation was followed by a Q&A session moderated by Suzana Carp from the Bellona Foundation.

According to the Bellona foundation, the package would require extensive synergies between different sectors as well as massive investments in infrastructure and innovation for its main targets to be achieved. Bellona flagged the fact that the electrification of mobility and the decarbonisation of many sectors would affect the total volume of electricity generated in the future, which may challenge the final impact of the decarbonisation strategy for the EU.

Other questions were related to carbon accounting, limitations of the electricity grid to support electric mobility and the production of low carbon fuel standards.

At the end of the event, there was a panel discussion on how to generate and finance green projects and investments to reach the EU climate target plans of 55 % net reduction target. Ivo participated as an active listener, by intervening over the discussion that lasted around 70 minutes.
