In the tender specifications, 2.6. Financial offer:

It is up to the tenderer to submit a financial offer on the basis of his estimation of the costs related to the performance the requested services. The contractor may take into consideration that the estimated amount of work involved to carry out this contract is assessed at around 350 man/days whereas the indicative budget for all other costs, including translation costs, costs related to the organisation of the events, travel and subsistence costs of own staff as well as of experts/speakers/official representatives of Member States participating in the events are assessed at around 350,000.00 EUR .

In the tender specifications, 3.2 Description of tasks, Task 5:

Within the task, the contractor will be required to collect opinions and consult relevant stakeholders and experts from the EU and the Member States. This should include the organisation of one 1-day stakeholder event for 70-80 participants in Brussels to discuss the results of the analyses carried out within Task 5 and the options for possible revision of the Annex VII of the EED. The event should be organised back-to-back to one of the meetings of the Energy Efficiency Directive Committee. The contractor will be responsible for arranging the venue, catering and any other necessary logistics to organise the event.

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INSTEAD OF

In the tender specifications, 3.2 Description of tasks, Task 6:

The contractor is required to organise a series of five cross-border (involving several EU Member States) 1.5-2 day training workshops (up to 50-60 participants each excluding speakers) in five different Member States for the relevant authorities and stakeholders including national consumers associations, associations of housing cooperatives, tenants/owners associations, etc. The aim of the training workshops would be to promote related consumers rights as well as practical good practices with cost-effective individual metering and billing of heat/cool/hot water consumption in multi-apartment and multi-purpose buildings. The events should engage at least 6-7 invited competent experts from other countries to share experience and expertise during the workshops. The contractor will arrange for simultaneous interpretation from/into English to/from the language of the host country. Where possible, the events should include short site visits to nearby locations where accurate individual heat/cool/hot water meters can be seen in operation.

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
