withdrawing the Proposal for a Council Decision on the position to be taken on behalf of Euratom in the 33rd meeting of the Energy Charter Conference COM(2022) 522 final

THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Euratom Treaty,

Whereas:

- (1) The Energy Charter Treaty ('the Agreement') was concluded by Council and Commission Decision 98/181/EC, ECSC, Euratom¹ and entered into force on 16 April 1998.
- (2) In 2019, the Contracting Parties engaged in negotiations to modernise the Agreement in order to bring it into alignment with the principles of the Paris Agreement, the requirements of sustainable development and the fight against climate change, as well as with modern standards of investment protection. The Contracting Parties concluded the negotiations on 24 June 2022. The negotiated outcome was meant to be adopted at the 33rd meeting of the Energy Charter Conference on 22 November 2022.
- (3) On 5 October 2022, the Commission adopted a Proposal for a Council Decision on the position to be taken on behalf of Euratom in the 33rd meeting of the Energy Charter Conference supporting the Agreement's modernisation (COM(2022) 522 final).
- (4) However, ahead of the meeting of the Energy Charter Conference, at a vote in Coreper on 18 November 2022, the Council was unable to adopt the Commission proposal. As evidenced by subsequent discussions in the Council, Euratom is still not and will not be able to adopt the modernisation of the Energy Charter Treaty.
- (5) In the absence of a Euratom position, the adoption of the modernised Agreement by the Energy Charter Conference is impossible. The current, unmodernised Agreement continues to apply to Euratom, in spite of the fact that is not in line with the Union's investment policy and law, including in particular the principle of autonomy of Union law, and with the Union's energy and climate goals. With no alternative available, the Commission has adopted a proposal for a Council decision on the withdrawal of Euratom from the Agreement.
- (6) The Proposal for Council Decision COM(2022) 522 final has therefore become moot and should be withdrawn.
