### Help from energy to non-energy countries

- YES, of course, people should help each other anyway!

- Is it really feasible to have in each and every country the RW waste disposal facility?
  - In the country A that generates **1,000 m<sup>3</sup>** per year and
  - in the country B that generates **2** m<sup>3</sup> per year
- That is neither optimal, nor economical, nor even safest!

• Let us help each other by joining forces and creating one or only few best possible disposal sites!





# Ljubljana in Slovenia





# **1914 – Austro-Hungarian Empire**





### **Before 1940 – first Yugoslavia**





# **1941-43 Occupation by Italy**





# **1943-45 Occupation by III Reich**





# 1945-1991 Yugoslavia




