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# TSO/DSO cooperation: work in progress

- **Allow and incentivise DSOs to use flexibility and choose the optimal solution**
- **Market-based allocation of flexibilities is preferable, although other methods might be chosen in special situations:**
  - Intermediate model vs long-term vision
  - Allow DSOs to own and operate flexibility devices like storage within the approved regulatory activities
- **Develop flexibility products together with stakeholders**
- **Prevent gaming and abuse of market power by market participants**

- **Co-ordination procedures for data management and control of flexibilities must respect the One System Approach that is based on the responsibility of each System Operator**
- **Market organisation to be guided by the preferences of the market participants**

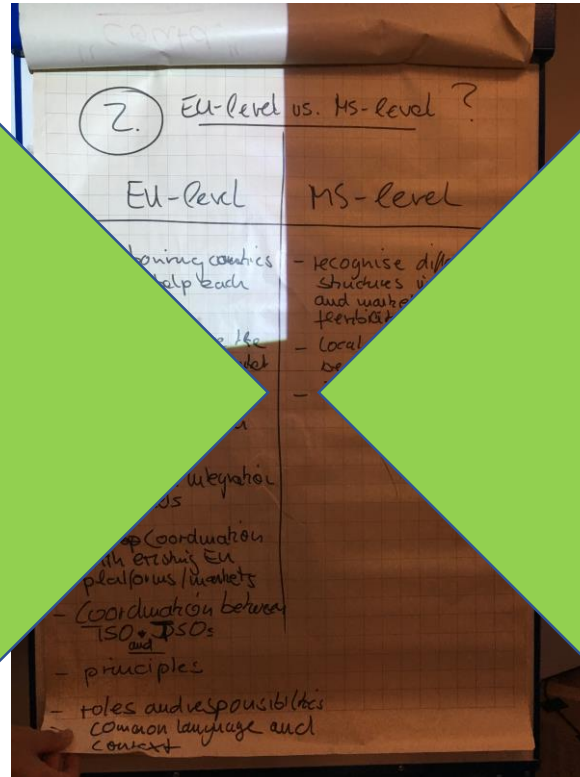

# Harmonisation of high-level principles only

- Sound regulatory principles deliver value by enabling the quick establishment of flexibility markets. Overregulation may limit it!
- Sound regulatory principles include high level rights and responsibilities while respecting local conditions

**Congestion management is national/local**

**Minimum common ground with cross-border balancing and wholesale markets**
