A world where key national policy makers view energy efficiency (EE) as a resource and implement cost effective policies to promote it.

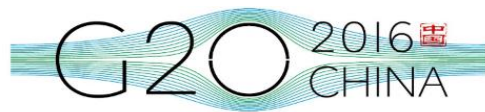

G20 Energy Efficiency Action Plan

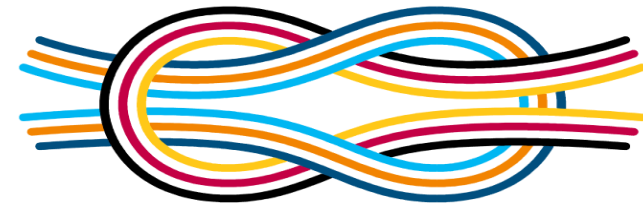

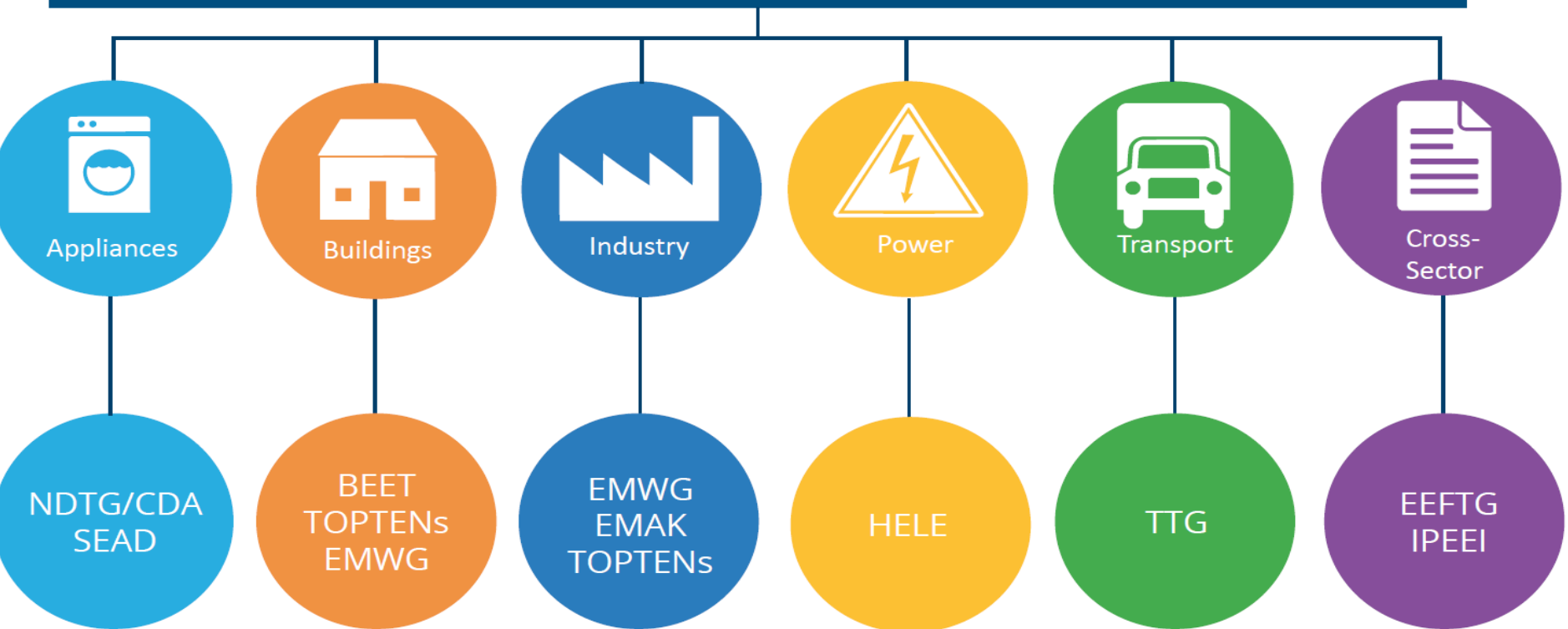
