

RESOLVED to establish among the Parties an integrated market in natural gas and electricity, based on common interest and solidarity,


title IV chapter IV: mutual assistance in the event of disruption

Article 44: In the event of disruption of Network Energy supply affecting a Party and involving another Party or a third country, the Parties shall seek an expeditious resolution in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter.

Article 45: Upon request of the Party directly affected by the disruption, the Ministerial Council shall meet. The Ministerial Council may take the necessary measures in response to the disruption.

Article 194 TFEU


- 1. In the context of the establishment and functioning of the **internal market** and with regard for the need to preserve and improve the **environment**, Union policy on energy shall aim, in a **spirit of solidarity between Member States**, to:
 - (a) ensure the functioning of the energy market;
 - (b) ensure security of energy supply in the Union; and
- (c) promote **energy efficiency** and energy saving and the development of new and **renewable forms of energy**; and
 - (d) promote the interconnection of energy networks.
- 2. Without prejudice to the application of other provisions of the Treaties, the European Parliament and the Council, acting in accordance with the ordinary legislative procedure, shall **establish the measures necessary to achieve the objectives** in paragraph 1. Such measures shall be adopted after consultation of the Committee of the Regions and the Economic and Social Committee.

Such measures shall not affect a Member State's right to determine the conditions for exploiting its energy resources, its choice between different energy sources and the general structure of its energy supply, without prejudice to Article 192(2)(c).

3. By way of derogation from paragraph 2, the Council, acting in accordance with a special legislative procedure, shall unanimously and after consulting the European Parliament, establish the measures referred to therein when they are primarily of a fiscal nature.
