

# Methodological notes on monthly data reporting

The Market Observatory for Energy (EMOS) has created this user-friendly interface to help the Member States report their data on oil, while enhancing the reporting capabilities of the Commission Services via EMOS. These reporting obligations on oil (monthly crude oil imports and supply costs) are covered. These EMOS web forms are designed on the basis of oil-related legislations and recommendations. Regarding crude oil imports and supply costs, the Commission produces summary reports at EU level published on the website of DG Energy.

## COUNCIL REGULATION (EC) No 2964/95 of 20 December 1995

introducing registration **for crude oil imports and deliveries** in the Community

Under this EC regulation, Member States have to submit each month data on crude oil imports and deliveries via EMOS web-forms. These data are published under the responsibility of the head of the economic analysis unit (Unit ENER A4) of the Directorate-General for Energy (DG ENER).

'Import' means each quantity of crude oil which enters the customs territory of the Community for purposes other than transit. 'Delivery' means each quantity of crude oil coming from another Member State for purposes other than transit.

For each type of crude oil, the information shall comprise:

- the designation of the crude oil, including the average API gravity,
- the quantity in barrels,
- the average cif price,
- the number of companies reporting,
- the percentage sulphur content.

Hereby based on this information, the Member States should send to the Commission the monthly crude oil imports governments reporting form in the month following the end of the month in question. The submission should be via EMOS web forms.

On the basis of these two legislations, Member States shall communicate to the Commission the following information:

-the monthly crude oil supply cost cif in the month following the end of the month in question.

'Supply cost' means the cost of crude oil imports, deliveries from other Member States and crude oil produced in the Member State.

"crude oil produced in a Member State" shall mean all crude oil produced and refined in a Member State, where such such production represents more than 15 % on an annual basis of the total crude oil supply of that Member State

The Member States should forward the table below to the Commission within a period of one month from the end of the month concerned. On the basis of this table EMOS web-forms were designed for data submission.
